Down the memory Lane

Andaman Trunk Road (ATR) connects South Andaman Island to Middle and North Andaman Islands. These were separated from each other by Three marine Channels Middle, Humfray and Austin Strait. Unfortunately these areas were also reserve tribal belt for Jarwa Tribe, a fierce, preserve, rare protected Aboriginal Tribe famous for their marks manship with Bows and Arrows. They have continued to live in shear isolation from civilized world in almost natural condition till date.

After partition and during sixties large number of migrants infiltrated into India. GOI decided to settle these migrants in various island in North and Middle

Andman. All weather motorable road connecting North and South Andman were essential. after weighting all pros and cons including effect on Jarwa Tribe approved construction of Andman Trunk Road (ATR). Work was included in 2nd Five year plan and started in 1958. Alignment of road through Jarwa Reserve Forest was decided in consultation with Ministry of Surface Transport, GOI to ensure least interference with their territorial limit to avoid future conflict

APWD was entrusted with execution of work. Massive man power, machinery and team of Wooden inscription at Jirkatang section unskilled staffs were deployed.

Fierce topological rain forest, inconsistent rain and unstable nature of soil posed major logistics and technical challenges during construction. Workers have to camp in Malaria infested, inhospitable, inaccessible location devoid of basic facilities and full of natural adversity

Construction in reserve forest area of Jarwa Tribe from Jirkatang to Middle Strait can be considered as war between progress and protection of Native Aborigine Tribal. It was fought between determined man with machine for development and equally determined Aboriginal Tribe against Human interference in their Life style. Aboriginal Tribe battled civilized human brethren determined to subdue challenge of nature with invention and grit.

There were Causalities on both sides. 08 Nos. APWD staffs and one constable of Jarwa Police were killed while on duty. A wooden Inscription at Jirkatang section (photo of memorial at center) has been placed in their memory.

Work was suspended between 87 km to 110 Km in Sept 1975 by GOI. Later on Hon'ble Minister of State for Homes, Sri Yogbendra Makwan reviewed it, and construction resumed in that stretch. Alignment was shifted as far away as possible from jarwa Reserve Territory. Work in this stretch was completed in 1988-89.

Part of road in North Andaman from Nabhagram to Austin strait was deferred till more settlement took place in that Area. In 1987 clearance was accorded for this area. It was completed in Mid 2000. Total length of road is 333 Kms with 1300 Culverts, 14 Bridges and 3 Major straits with Ferry services across


Today it has become major Artery of Andaman, carrying bulk passenger and tourist across the

VIGILANCE AWARENESS WEEK

In order to create general awareness among public and public servant Vigilance Awareness Week was observed during 1_{st} week of Nov. 2012. Superintendent of Police, CBI, Special Branch accompanied with other officials had an interactive session with Executive Engineer's and Assistant Engineer's of APWD on theme subject 'Transparency in Public Procurement'. He emphasized on general need of transparency in various activities of public service department like PWD and requested all officers to ensure implementation of codal formalities in public procurement. He also wished greater participation from officers of the department to prevent unwanted vigilance quarries from different quarters in form of general discussion and consultation when ever required.

National Rural Drinking Water programme

In order to prepare Master Plan Data Base for water resources in A&N islands, ANWSM recruited technical and administrative staffs on contact basis to staff various Nodal Center in state which shall be attached with Division and Subdivision of APWD.

Newly recruited technical staffs were imparted preliminary training at training hall of Chief Engineer's office by resource person Sri Amlonjit Kar, scientist CGWB, kolkatta and his associate. They were trained in various aspects of data collection such as Sampling method, Data collection and water testing. New recruits have been posted to different places of posting in the Territory. Central water laboratory has also been handed over to ANWSM for testing of water samples and preparation of Data Base.

APPOINTMENT

Sri Jose P. John, Assistant Engineer, has been appointed as Director, ANWSM on deputation basis by Administration. He has been relieved off from the post of Assistant Engineer(Works), CE's Office to allow him to join as Director, ANWSM. However he shall continue to hold additional charges of AE(Works) till further order.

TRAINING & WORKSHOP

- A training work shop on Water Quality Monitoring, Surveillance and Water Quality Assurance sponsored by Ministry of Drinking Water and Sanitation, GOI was organized by Department of Sanitary Engineering, AIIH&PH, Kolkatta in collaboration with APWD at Mayabunder, North and Middle Andaman on 9th & 10th November ,2012. Sri Sanjay Kumar , DC N&M Andaman was Chief Guest. Dr.R.C Srivastava, Professor and HOD Dept. of Sanitary Engineering, AIIH&PH, Calcutta was main Resource Person. Work shop was attended by Members of Panchayti Raj institution, Health Workers of the District, Junior and Assistant Engineer's of APWD in charge of water supply system in these Island. At concluding function Shri P.K. Singh, Chief Engineer was Chief Guest. He also distributed Certificate to participants.
- A 3 days training programme was organized from 13-15 Dec. 2012 in the Chief Engineer's office, on "Contract Management and Arbitration and Dispute Settlement Mechanism" by ISDA in collaboration with CIDC of Ministry of Human Resource Development. 36 Nos Executive Engineer / Assistant Engineer participated in the training programme.

Training cell of APWD organized the programme. Curriculum was specially designed and developed by ISDA in concurrence with APWD to include relevant topics in details to ensure easy grasp and practice. This has been considered as right step in right direction considering large Nos of litigation being started by executing agencies due to lack of awareness and other agreement related complications. Commr. Cum Secretary (PW), Smt. Punnya Salila Srivastava, her self showed keen interest in the training and attended one of the sessions on 14/12/12. She was present in concluding function and distributed Certificate to participants.

PRESENTATION AND SEMINAR

A presentation was made by M/s ALCHEMIST on use of RBI (Road Building International) Grade 81, Pavement material soil stabilizer on 19" Oct, 2012 in the Lecture hall of CE's Office, which was well attended by Engineer's of Department.

Technical Director, Retired IRC scientist, presented need for using RBI which is an international recognized Material to improve Soil strength, Elastic property and other benefit along with method for application. He also introduced New machineries for repair of road which shall recycle old laid down premix mixture during relaying process of overlay resulting in considerable economy in repair. He also proposed to demonstrate benefit of this material in terms of economy, strength and durability if opportunities are provided.

INDIAN BUILDING CONGRESS

Indian Building Congress held it's first presentation in the Training Hall of CE's Office on Green Building Construction. Sri Manu Thomas, Secretary IBC, Port Blair presented, Concept, Requirements, Practices, Future scope and GRIHA Rating system of Green Building Construction. THORATANG STEEL BRIDGE AT BETAPUR

Thoratang Bridge is 180 feet long steel bridge, designed for IRC class 40R loading with TDR (Triple Double Reinforced) Specification. This bridge has been constructed in place of earlier wooden deck bridge as part of administration policy to replace all old wooden bridge in the island into permanent steel or RCC bridges. It has been constructed ahead of schedule at the cost of ₹ 3.00 Crore and opened for public by Hon' ble LG on 20/12/12.
